Public input is being sought about applying for federal stimulus funds being offered for fire station construction by the Department of Homeland Security. Although there is no guarantee that North Fond du Lac would receive funding, Fire Chief Paul Nelson said awards could be around \$2 million—the estimate for a new 16,000-square-foot building. However, additional funding of up to \$300,000 would be required for non-construction expenses, such as land acquisition, that would not be covered by the grant.

The Fire Department has a full-time paramedic ambulance service and 54 fire and EMS services members. Due to insufficient space in the current building, some equipment is parked elsewhere and emergency medical service employees who work 24-hour shifts are housed off site.

Along with housing the department's equipment, offices, and a training area, a new building could also be used as an alternate emergency operations center.
