The North Fond du Lac Police Department has closed its investigation into a fight that was reported to police on January 28. A 23 year-old North Fond du Lac man, Shane Tilleman, reported that he wound up in a physical altercation with several people after confronting a man who was “spinning doughnuts” in a parking lot near his home.

The department received a tip on Thursday from a witness who told police that the man that reported the incident was lying to them about what happened. Officers re-interviewed Tilleman who told police that he actually had the group of people over at his house earlier in the evening. He told officers that “things were getting crazy”, so he told one of them that he had to leave. Tilleman said that man, 19 year-old Kyle Johnston of Fond du Lac, went outside and began “spinning doughnuts.” He said that he confronted Johnson in the car and was struck in the face by him. Tilleman told police that the rest of Johnson’s friends had also come out of the house at this point and started jumping on him. Tilleman said he had previously lied to police because he didn't want anything done with the situation and was just glad that the subjects left the area.

When police interviewed the other subjects involved, they reported that it was Tilleman who had become physical when outside the residence. According to those subjects, after coming outside to confront Johnston about his driving, Tilleman struck a passenger in the car numerous times. That man told officers that he was not interested in pursuing the matter with police. According to those individuals, Tilleman had been bragging about being in a fight the night before, which is when he reportedly suffered a black eye.

Police learned that several of the individuals involved in this incident are on probation. The matter has been reported to Probation & Parole. Officers also cited Tilleman for Obstructing an Officer because of the false information he initially reported to police, and have issued a citation to Johnston for Disorderly Conduct with a Motor Vehicle.
