North Fond du Lac police were forced to use a TASER to take a 52 year-old North Fond du Lac man into custody following a domestic violence incident on Tuesday evening. David L. Lallier (07-29-54) was arrested on Wednesday night on charges of Disorderly Conduct and Resisting an Officer.

On May 22, Officers responded to a call from the man's wife, who reported that she had been receiving several threatening and harassing phone calls. The woman explained to police that she and her husband are divorcing. She told officers that her husband had been calling and threatening her and the man she has been seeing. According to the woman, one of the comments made was, "Tell [him] to sleep with one eye open. Tonight is the night I will get him. Watch out! You're next."

Police were unable to locate Lallier that night and continued to look for him on Wednesday. Officers were finally able to make contact with Lallier at his residence on Polk Street late Wednesday night. Lallier told police that the incident was nothing more than "he said, she said." When police attempted to take Lallier into custody for Disorderly Conduct, he began to physically resist. Lallier grabbed hold of a light pole and refused to let go when police tried to handcuff him. Lallier told the officers, "No! You will not arrest me," and "Just pull your gun out and shoot me then!"

Officer Mickie Spencer-Fink deployed her TASER, striking Lallier in the back. Lallier immediately fell to the ground and continued to resist attempts to handcuff him until he was warned that the TASER would again be deployed if he didn't cooperate. At that point, Lallier cooperated with police and was taken into custody without further incident. While being transported to the jail, Lallier apologized to the officer saying he didn't know what he was thinking.

No one was injured in the incident. Lallier posted \$450 cash bond and was released from custody.
